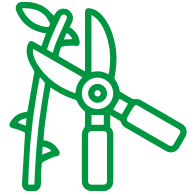


Spring Gardening Checklist

Early Spring

Start here to get your yard ready for the growing season ahead.

- Clean the flowerbeds
- Divide your perennials
- Add fresh mulch around perennials
- Prune trees and shrubs
- Perform basic maintenance on your hardscaping
- Plant vegetables



Midspring

Halfway through the season, you should start to see your spring landscape take shape, as more and more bulbs, perennials, shrubs, and trees start growing, possibly even blooming. With most of the cleanup completed, you can get started adding new plants.

- Clean bird feeders
- Make notes as you watch the spring show
- Plant new perennials and cold-hardy annuals
- Add new trees and shrubs
- Apply fresh mulch



Late Spring

In late spring, you can start cleaning up flowers that have already bloomed. It's also time to get planting in earnest to fill out your garden.

- Deadhead flowering bulbs
- Shop for summer annuals
- Start warm-season vegetables
- Plant summer-blooming bulbs
